2. Choose the best camper: How many berths? How much space for packing? What facilities do you need on board?
3. Pack winter essentials: Take lots of thin layers to keep warm. Pack boots and waterproofs for active days out. Take bikes to enjoy the outdoors.
4. Take a camera for some beautiful wintery shots at dawn / dusk.
5. Empty waste water before bed (to stop it freezing overnight).
6. Pack luxuries like hot chocolate and marshmallows, mince pies and your favourite tipple!
